## **JD/MBA Program**

The joint degree JD/MBA Program allows students who are interested in law and business to simultaneously pursue the Juris Doctor Degree and Master's degree in Business Administration. Application to and acceptance by both the School of law and the School of Business are required. The degree of Juris Doctor is granted upon the completion of a minimum of 88 semester hours of required and elective courses. Semester hours required for the MBA range from a total of 33 required and elective semester hours for the student with an undergraduate business degree meeting all foundation course requirements, to **63** hours for the student who needs credits in the foundation course areas.
