*****IMPORTANT – PLEASE NOTE*****

A student from another ABA-approved law school may be granted visiting student status to attend classes at the School of Law for an academic term or year. Students must have completed 29 hours of law credits to be eligible to become a visiting student. A visiting student will be ineligible to receive a degree from NCCU School of Law. Native NCCU students have priority enrollment in classes of their choice and there is no guarantee that a visiting student will be able to register for specific courses. Please note that visiting students must adhere to the drop/add and grading deadlines for North Carolina Central University, which may not correspond to a visiting student's home institution. Also, visiting students must qualify for financial aid through their home institution and will not qualify for financial aid from North Carolina Central University. However, North Carolina Central University will honor a consortium agreement with your home institution, subject to the approval of the Office of Scholarship and Student Aid.
